When is Winter Camp?

From 6:00 am on Saturday, December 28, 2019 through 2:30pm on Monday, December 30, 2019. Merit badges will be taught starting at 8:00 am on Saturday and end on Sunday at 12:45 pm. Troops are encouraged to arrive the evening before by 5:00 pm on December 27, 2019. Troops will be responsible for their own meals until camp begins.

Where will Winter Camp be held and how do I get there?

Winter Camp will be at Camp Sol Mayer off HWY 190 on FM 864, 20 miles west of Menard, TX. For directions please visit, http://tswcbsa.org/pages/sol-mayer. You can also plug in the address into Google Maps and it will show you to the front gate. 299 Sol Mayer Road, Menard, TX 76859-9205.

What does it cost to attend?

The fees for each Scout cover, meals, program materials, insurance and a patch. See the chart below and register early to guarantee your spot and campsite.

The fees for each adult/non-Scout are in the table below. Camperships are available and will be reviewed by the council office. Forms are available upon request.

Check-In & Check-Out

Check-in will begin around 7:30 am at the Trading Post, after breakfast on Saturday, December 28, 2019. If arriving on December 27th, troops will be responsible for their own meals that day. Check-out will start at 2:30 pm on Monday, December 30, 2019. Lunch will be the last meal served at 1:00pm.

Please note that troops are strongly encouraged to come the evening before the start of winter camp. This is a great time for scouts to work on cooking advancement and to enjoy some outdoor cooking! Troops will have the option to stay the night of the 30th if they would like. Having well rested leaders for the drive home is of the utmost importance. We want everyone to return home safely!

Out of Council Troops

Out of Council troops will be required to fill out a Sol Mayer camp reservation form for the night of December 27th at http://www.tswcbsa.org/camps/sol-mayer/reservations.htm. Camping will be free of charge for that night.

Troop Check-In

- A copy of your BSA generated roster from your local Council Service Center with the names of those youth and adults in attendance highlighted.
- A copy of your Complete Annual Health and Medical Record for all Scouts and adult leaders attending camp. All medical forms should be in a three ring binder with the Troop Name clearly visible on the front. Binders will be returned to the troop at check-out. Shots must be dated with year, or official shot records must be attached to the medical forms.
- For each adult attending camp, the following must be turned in prior to, or upon arrival:
- Pre-submitted and approved Adult Application for Participation to Texas Southwest Council (see Forms).
- Copy of your Youth Protection Certification dated after October 2018.

NOTE: If any of these forms are missing, the adult will not be allowed to remain at camp.

- All fees should be paid in full and reconciled with the Texas Southwest Council Service Center.
- All LDS units will need to bring two (2) copies of their insurance claim form.

Health Forms

An Annual Health and Medical Record (parts A & B) which can be found at: http://www.scouting.org/filestore/HealthSafety/pdf/680-001_AB.pdf. Physicals used for summer camp may be used if it has been less than one (1) year since it was performed. No one will be allowed to stay in camp without a current medical form and valid YPT.

Persons who become ill before camp begins should stay home. Camp Sol Mayer reserves the right to refuse admittance to any camper who has developed any physical and/or mental situation which could present a hazard to themselves or to others.

Medication(s) & Allergies

Troop Leaders and Camp Administration must know which scouts take daily prescribed medications. Each troop should have a trusted adult to administer medications at the proper times needed. Parents are required to send the correct amount of medication with their scout for the duration of their trip. If medication is not sent, then parents will be liable and will have to come and retrieve their scout at their own expense within 24 hours. If needed, local authorities will be notified. No refunds will be issued. This is to ensure that everyone has a great and safe time at Winter Camp. Scouts should not be allowed to come to camp without their medication(s). Not only is it dangerous for them, but for others around them. Please inform the Camp Director of any participants with Allergies (food, insects, etc.) prior to arrival at camp.

Participant Form

All participants must complete the Participant Form located at the end of this packet.

Youth Protection Requirements

All Adult participants and leaders are required to have current BSA YPT Training available in their MyScouting account. Each adult must have this training prior to arriving to camp. All adults are required to fill-out and turn in the attached form to authorize a background check to be performed. This form must be turned in before or at the time of registration. Please make as many copies of this form as needed for each adult that will be attending.

Phone and Camp Director Contact

Camp Sol Mayer does not have a landline. If you need to get a hold of someone during camp, contact the camp director via email (andrew.brooks@scouting.org) or by phone at (325)271-1703. AT&T is the only cellular provider that works well at Camp Sol Mayer.

Camp Health and Safety

A Health Lodge is located on camp and will be staffed by one or more persons trained to handle minor accidents or illnesses. Treatment of more serious cases will need to be sent to San Angelo for medical care. San Angelo is an hour away. In the event such treatment is required, the camper's parents will be notified by telephone of the nature of the emergency and their desires concerning further treatment. If anyone is ill before or upon arrival at camp, we highly recommend those that are ill stay home or return home.

Visitors

Visitors are always welcome in camp, but we do ask that they check-in and check-out with the office, so we know who is in camp. Visitors are classified as a non-registered member of the Boy Scouts of America and those individuals who do not have the proper health forms, youth protection certificate, or completed winter camp application documents. At check-in, they will be given an ID band.

Visitors may bring their meal with them or they may purchase meal tickets for \$5.00 (per person, per meal) at the Trading Post. Please let us know as soon as possible if meals will be needed by visitors so we can ensure we have enough food to feed everyone. Visitors are not permitted to spend the night in camp.

Camp Security

Everyone in attendance at the camp must wear identification that signifies legitimate participation in the camping program. Wristbands will be the method used at Camp Sol Mayer. The importance of wearing this identification will be stressed when the unit checks in.

If someone is on camp that does not have either a camper or visitor ID band, they should be escorted to the camp office so that the staff can determine why they are in camp and issue an ID band if needed.

Trading Post

The camp maintains a trading post to serve you. Trading Post hours may vary but will be open throughout the day and evening except during meal times. Items such as candy, soft drinks, Sol Mayer items, shirts, handicraft supplies, and more will be available at the Trading Post. Please be prepared by bringing enough toiletries to avoid the 20-mile trip into town.

Campsites

All of the campsites are of a good size so two troops may be selected to occupy the same campsite. Campsites will be assigned according to preference from the reservation form. Please note that troops may not get their first choice. (Forms Section of Leader's Guide) Troops will follow Leave No Trace by keeping their campsite tidy and free of litter. Troops will also be asked to sign up for latrine duty. The camp facilities will be clean upon arrival and we ask that they are clean upon departure. Thank you for your cooperation. The Camp Ranger has asked that all troops pack in and pack out their own garbage. Camp Sol Mayer is one of few camps trying to keep a small waste footprint by being as green as possible.

Maverick Campers


Some units are unable to attend Winter Camp due to scheduling issues. If you have Scouts that want to attend without a leader, please work with another unit or contact the council office. While we want everyone to attend camp that wants to, we would like to know, in advance, if we need to make arrangements for these youth.

Early Scout Release from Camp

At Camp Sol Mayer, it is required to check Scouts out of camp with adults that are approved by the camp unit leader or the parent's name that appears on the Scout's medical form. Any adult not approved by the camp unit leader and not named on the Scout's medical form must have a completed "Release Authorization Form" to check the Scout out of camp. This release form is available from the council office upon request.

Theme for 2019

This year's Winter Camp theme is "Scout Heritage!" Scouting has been around in the United States since 1910, and has a rich and distinctive history. We ask that you bring your best "old school" skills with you and compete in the Scouting Heritage Olympics. We will set aside an hour for troops to compete in "BSA Jeopardy", Pioneering, and the "Baden Powell Course" comprised of a few camp games that have been around since the inception of the BSA.



Meals

All meals will be served in the dining hall. We have made every effort to provide an appropriate menu for winter conditions. If you have dietary needs/restrictions (allergies, diabetes, etc.) please contact the council office as soon as possible so we can ensure everyone's needs are met. Some dietary needs may require that the family of a scout provides sufficient meals. NOTE: Troops will be responsible for bringing their own mess kits. Each scout and adult must bring (plate, bowl, spoon, fork, knife, cup)

Every meal will have hot chocolate available.

Coffee will be brewed throughout the day in the Dining Hall and the Admin Building upon request.

Adult Leadership

Each unit must have responsible adult leadership which consists of at least two (2) adult leaders in camp at all times. For the leaders, one must be at least 21 years of age and the second must be at least 18 years of age. At least one Leader must be a "trained" leader. If your unit is unable to secure two-deep leadership for the entire stay at camp contact your council office.

If you have adults that will only be in camp part of the time we ask that, at check-in, we are notified who will be in camp, and when.

General Cleanliness

The eleventh point of the Scout Law is CLEAN. If everyone does their part to keep the entire camp clean, the workload is greatly reduced for everyone. Troops are responsible for their garage in their camp

The bathhouse (with hot water) will be available for everyone. We ask for everyone to do their part and leave things better than they found them. Leave No Trace is important. If supplies are needed, ask camp management. We will get the needed supplies!

Emergency Action Plan & Camp Emergencies

In the event of a camp emergency, notify the Camp Director, Program Director, Camp Ranger, and/or the Camp Medical Officer immediately. Where an emergency involving a camper is concerned, the appropriate Scoutmaster/unit leader should also be contacted. Emergency phone numbers are posted at the main camp office.

With the exception of a weather emergency, all campers are to report immediately to the dining hall upon hearing an emergency signal. In the case of a weather emergency, campers should go to assigned protective shelter. Once the weather emergency has passed, campers should report to their campsites. Campers should remain in the campsites until the "all clear" signal has been given. Leaders should review these procedures with their campers.

Clothing

We do ask that everyone wear their Scout Field Uniform appropriately for our evening meals but do understand that staying warm and dry may take precedence.

Unit leaders, we ask that you ensure all of your Scouts have the necessary clothing and camping supplies, so they will be warm and dry throughout their time in camp.

Lost & Found

A Scout is Honest. Lost and found items will be kept at the Admin office only. Lost money and valuable items will be turned in to the Camp Director. Leaders and parents should urge Scouts to mark all possessions with the name and troop number. Please check with the Administration office to inquire about lost and found items or to turn in found items. We want every scout to leave with the items they came to camp with. Any items that are extremely valuable or irreplaceable should be left at home.

Campsite Inspections

There will be campsite inspections conducted by the Camp Commissioners. They will be looking for camp gadgets, an updated fire guard chart, duty roster, overall camp tidiness, and more. The goal is to be the best troop of the camp! Each troop that gets the prized commissioner totem will get to leave their mark on the spirit stick and have bragging rights!

Awards

Troops will have the opportunity to earn some camp awards. Some awards include: Top Troop, Best Campsite, Troop Spirit, Sharp Uniforms and more.





2019 Winter Camp Packing List

All Participants MUST bring THEIR OWN MESS KIT. (Plate, bowl, knife, fork, spoon, cup/bottle)

- Non-disposable water container (Canteen, sports bottle, camel-bak, etc.)
- Matches and/or firestarter (Scout must have his or her firem'n chit, and Scoutmaster must approve)

Scouts will have the chance for some free time throughout the day will be able to use the sports field to play soccer, ultimate Frisbee, or they can go over and play Gaga Ball in the designated area.

Fishing

Scouts will be allowed to fish in the San Saba River. The designated areas are alongside the river campsites. Please do not allow scouts to fish from the waterfront. Fish are catch and release only. Scouts will need their own fishing gear.

Inter-Faith Worship Service

The last point in the Scout Law is REVERENT. An inter-faith worship service will be held at the Amphitheater. (Inclement weather: Dining Hall)

Campfire

Each troop, or patrol, will have the opportunity to show off their best skit at our campfire on the final night of camp. Staff will also be adding their own cool skits in the mix. It is highly suggested that everyone brings a camp chair to campfire. If you would like to stay after and gaze at the stars, you are more than welcome. Feel free to bring your own telescope.

Order of the Arrow

If requested, Our Lodge will hold a callout ceremony following the closing campfire. Please notify the Camp Staff when you register if you will be requesting a call-out ceremony.

All OA members are encouraged to wear their sash on Saturday, with the field uniform or an OA T- shirt.

Adult Leader Programs

IOLS – Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills

Outdoor skills are critical to the success of the Scouting program, and **Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills** will provide leaders with the basic outdoor skills information needed to start a program right. The skills taught are based on the outdoor skills found in the *Scouts BSA Handbook*. The course is also ideal for Venturing leaders because it focuses on skills that build confidence and competence in leaders conducting outdoor camping experiences.

A Scoutmaster and Assistant Scoutmaster is considered trained upon completion of Scoutmaster Leader Specific Training and the *Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills*. Troop committee members and Webelos Den Leaders who plan to move into a leadership position in a troop are encouraged to complete this training as well.

This hands-on program gives adult leaders a practical introduction to the patrol method of a Scout-led troop by teaching many of the practical outdoor skills they need to lead Scouts in the out-of-doors. In addition, the teaching methods, activities, and games model the variety of teaching used in effective and engaging Scouting programs. Participants should leave the training experience with a full understanding of how the patrol method operates, a feeling of comfort in working with and instructing their Scouts, and an increased level of confidence taking Scouts outdoors safely.

Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills is required for Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters to earn the *Scouter's Training Award*.

Scoutmaster's Fire Building Contest - Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters compete in a matchless fire building competition. Contestants are scored based on speed, safety, knowledge of fire and fire building techniques and number of attempts. This is a chance to showcase your skills to your scouts.

Scoutmaster's Merit Badge – This is obviously not a real merit badge. But an award given to Scoutmasters for completing the following requirements:

- 1. Must be a Scoutmaster or Assistant Scoutmaster
- 2. Compete in the Scoutmaster's Fire Building Contest
- 3. Complete 2 hours working on a service project as designated by the Camp Ranger.
- 4. Volunteer to assist with one of the following:
 - Teach one session of Personal Management (Must be a Personal Management Counselor)
 - Assist the Search and Rescue instructor during the mock search scenario.
 - Accompany Wilderness Survival class on their overnight in an improvised shelter of your own.

Leader's Horseshoes Competition - This one needs no explanation! Just good Fun!


